

TRADITION FOUR

Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole.

Thank God for the Traditions. Only after trial and error do we know what not to do. That leaves us a lot of space to continue with trial and error. Autonomous—in those days they called it a Ten Dollar word, today we might say a Thousand Dollar word. It's pretty simple. Each group can make up their own format, give the group a name (there are some doozies) find a place to have it, get two or more drunks that want to stay sober, bring the coffee, collect the money from the group to cover expenses, and there you have it.

Now, let's not be specialists, or authorities. Oh ya—we are talking about a bunch of “Ego Driven (hopefully want to be sober) Drunks” so the trial began years ago, we have been taught to learn from our mistakes, and sometimes we do. They all got carried away made it too big, with too much authority and control. At least we got the General Service Board and General Service Office out of the forerunner's ego trips. They had good intentions, and some good ideas. In fact they had 61 rules, too much, too much. So the “Good News” out of that experience was good ole Rule 62. “Don't take yourself too damn seriously.”



4. Do I always bear in mind that, to those outsiders who know I am in AA, I may to some extent represent our entire beloved Fellowship?
5. Am I willing to help a newcomer go to any lengths—his lengths, not mine—to stay sober?
6. Do I share my knowledge of AA tools with other members who may not have heard of them?




The Twelve Steps in Plain English



CONCEPT FOUR

Throughout our conference structure, we ought to maintain at all responsible levels a traditional “Right of Participation,” taking care that each classification or group of our world servants shall be allowed a voting representation in reasonable proportion to the responsibility that each must discharge.

In world service there are certain individuals who have voting privileges. The conference charter specifically provides for those who are able to vote. They are: Trustees; Directors of AA corporations (AA World services, Inc & the AA Grapevine, Inc), together with their respective executive staffs shall always be voting members of the general Service Conference.

Of course all members of the conference are also voting members. Who are the conference members? They are our representatives, District Committee Members (DCM’s) who are elected by the General Service representatives, who in turn are elected by each group.

The conference is held annually to make sure that AA world wide is carrying the message to the still suffering alcoholic. DCM’s get together in order to come up with the conference recommendations to the Trustees and conference. They obtain their information from the GSR’s who obtain their information from their groups.

When we elect individuals to represent us, we cannot tie their hands. Things come up at each conference and meeting where a vote is called for, they do not have time to return to the groups to find out if they should vote for those items on the ballot. We give them responsibility and they must vote on the spot. These representatives must take into consideration AA as a whole, not just their group’s views.

When we bring this back closer to home, such as Central office or districts, we must also give rights of participation. This means each individual in AA has the same right. For many months now, Central Office and general service have been asking groups to send representatives to those groups so they will have their right of participation. We have many groups in the Coachella Valley and upper desert. Yet when I attend the Central Office meeting and the District meetings I have not seen much of an increase of participation. My home group is represented by me, and I make sure to show up for each meeting. I am responsible to make my group’s view known so that they are obtaining their right of participation in the whole process.

My question is this. Is your group complaining about AA, Central Office, and District? Has your group elected a representative? Is your representative showing up to the meetings? If you answered no to some of these questions, I would suggest having elections in your group, so that your group obtains their right of participation.

Do you desire to have your right of Participation? The Central Office Intergroup meeting is held the first Thursday of the month at Central Office. GSR’s meet at the district level on the first Sunday of the month at Fellowship Hall in Palm Desert. See you there.

The Big Book outlines the way the inventory is to be done. You may want to add a 4th column that is "where am I at fault". If you do this as outlined, in columns, my experience has been the relief happened very quickly.

Look, if you really desire change, ask God for help and get honest. You may even want to ask yourself, "How serious am I?" If the answer is serious, get your pencil ready, kick your ego to the curb and free yourself of the lies and guilt that has held God back and stopped you from becoming the person that God meant you to be.
