#### **Tradition Six**



# **May Puzzle Solution**



## **Concept 6**

On behalf of A.A. as a whole, our General Service Conference has the principal responsibility for the maintenance of our world services, and it traditionally has the final decision respecting large matters of general policy and finance. But the Conference also recognized that the chief initiative and the active responsibility in most of these matters should be exercised primarily by the Trustee members of the Conference when they act among themselves as the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous.

The Trustees of Alcoholics Anonymous are comprised of 21 men and women. Of those, 14 are members of Alcoholics Anonymous and seven are nonalcoholics. They are elected for their experiences in business and other professional needs in order to ensure that the mission of Alcoholics Anonymous is carried out throughout our service corporations noted below. Since the inception of the General Service Board (of which the Trustees act as individual members not as a group) the only changes have been how the Trustees are comprised, yet their duties have remained the same.

The Trustee members of the conference are held mainly responsible for all service activities including but not limited to The A.A. Grapevine, Inc and A. A. World Services Inc. They, of course, operate under the scrutiny and occasional direction of the Conference. However, our charters have been designed to give them a great deal of authority and responsibility in the absence of the Conference.


Much like the Steering Committee of an Alano Club is responsible for the upkeep of the building and paying of the bills, the Trustees have certain authority over various forms of service from Public Information to Literature to Finance & Budgeting.

As per the Conference Charter, they are given much freedom within all service activities. This is due to the rather large number of transactions involved in our world service operation. With the operation of the service corporations being such a large undertaking, it stands to reason that we would grant the Trustees a large amount of authority, as none but the Trustees could make such decisions to ensure that the message and growth of A.A. is not only sustained but increased.

As stated in the A.A. Service Manual, "From top to bottom, our whole service structure indeed resembles that of a large corporation. The A.A. groups are the stockholders; the Delegates are their representatives or proxies at the 'annual meeting'; our General Service Board Trustees are actually the directors of a 'holding company.' And this holding company, the General Service Board, actually owns and controls the 'subsidiaries' which carry on our active world services.

This very real analogy makes it even more clear that, just like any other board of directors, our Trustees must be given large powers if they are to effectively manage the principal world affairs of Alcoholics Anonymous."
