

## **Concept 3**

To insure effective leadership, we should endow each element of A.A. - the Conference, the General Service Board, and its service corporations, staffs, committees, and executives - with a traditional "Right of Decision".

Concept 3 is the "Right of Decision." As trusted servants (Tradition 2), our leaders are allowed to decide which problems they will dispose of themselves and upon which matters they will report, consult, or ask specific directions. We must trust our leaders to make the right decisions for A.A. as a whole.

"This "Right of Decision" should never be made an excuse for failure to render proper reports of all significant actions taken; it ought never be used as a reason for constantly exceeding a clearly defined authority, nor as an excuse for persistently failing to consult those who are entitled to be consulted before an important decision is taken." Our ultimate authority is a loving God. If leaders are ineffective, inefficient, or abuse the 'Right of Decision', each group has the right to remedy the situation.

"Our entire A.A. program rests squarely upon the principle of mutual trust. We trust God, we trust A.A., and we trust each other. Therefore, we cannot do less than trust our leaders in service. The "Right of Decision" that we offer them is not only the practical means by which they may act and lead effectively, but it is also the symbol of our implicit confidence."



#### **Tradition Three**

The only requirement for A.A. membership is a desire to stop drinking.

The path for me to any continuous length of sobriety has been long and has consisted of several relapses over the last 20 years. Each one became more incomprehensibly demoralizing than the last. They all took me further down the ladder of contemptible acts and behaviors. Had it not been for Tradition Three -- because of my overwhelming guilt and embarrassment - I might not have felt so compelled and welcome to return to AA once again.

But I always knew that this program, God and all of you were here waiting with loving, open-arms to see me take another 24 hour chip. I knew I would not be judged by you but accepted by you as a member of AA because I had the desire to stop drinking. I had the desire and I declared myself a member of Alcoholics Anonymous.

And then, the "miracle" happened! I finally honestly admitted I was an alcoholic, and my life was unmanageable. I let you embrace me, and I embraced you back for the first time. I followed your suggestions and became teachable. I also came to believe that a power greater than myself could restore me to sanity. Thus, I was blessed with having the obsessive compulsion to drink removed!

Because of God, this program and all of you, I will be celebrating 2 years of continuous sobriety in a couple of months! My life is now full of love, joy, and acceptance of life as it is and others as they are. I am so very grateful to AA and for Tradition Three that states that anyone may be a member of AA because they have a desire to stop drinking.

## Playing Checkers or Playing Chess

How Far Should I Go? By Rick R.

Let me preface this article by saying that I am not being critical of anybody for any reason concerning where a person is along the path of sobriety. My only motive for writing it is to give some perspective concerning the possibilities which lie ahead based on the thoroughness we applied to the understanding of the steps as we put some distance between us and that last drink. I am one of the fortunate ones that showed up at the doors of Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A.) on October 15<sup>th</sup>, 1969, at the age of 28 and have never wanted a drink since that day. I was the youngest person in the room for my first couple of years as the drugs using population of the 60s generation had not started showing up until the mid-70s and they seemed to bottom out at a much earlier in life than the common variety alcoholic who seldom came to us until they were in their mid-40s. "midlife crisis" In my first two years, I was like everyone else when it came to the subject of thoroughness in the beginning and I was selective about what I would do with the program and about the things I would dismiss as unnecessary since I had absolutely no desire to drink. I was slow and deliberate when it came to taking the steps. It was almost two years before I attempted to do the 4th step inventory and being in the Navy at the time, I was shipped out to an oil tanker in the Tonkin gulf Yacht Club where I spent four months in and out of port hauling fuel to the fleet. I had many nights at sea thinking and longing to be back with my home group and contemplating what I had planned to do when I got home. When I did return home, I reopened my Fourth Step Inventory with a new attitude about the steps and realize that my original attempt was a very shallow scam and I burned it and started over and got it right the second time around. That, I think was the turning point in my attitude about thoroughness. I address those so-called tormenting ghosts of yesterday, shared them with another trusted member of the program and it just lifted the weight off my shoulders. That I believe, made the rest of the program much easier. I have attended a weekly step study meeting ever since and it helps me to measure my growth as I cycle through the Steps and Traditions several times a year. There is a term on page 85 in the Big Book and coincidentally on page 85 in the 12&12 that suggest this is no time to rest on our laurels, and I take that very seriously because of the unexpected results I have experienced concerning the quality of life I Live Today. Steps 10, 11, and 12 are referred to as the maintenance steps. With many years of sobriety, I could rest on my laurels and vegetate, but I would have no purpose in life and if I neglected responsibilities my life worth would suffer. Being judgmental about the behavior of others, I would be playing God and we all know that isn't right unless I am perfect myself. Scott Peck defines love as, caring for and nurturing another person, and I can love everyone even if they can't return the gesture. It just means wishing the best for them. (No Exceptions). These are just a few ideas but there are many ways to continue to have a purpose and if you don't, you may want to revisit the 4th through the 9th steps and get a better perspective on how to become a more useful member of society and be fulfilled or, you may be satisfied just not drinking one day at a time. That's your choice. I heard a sportscaster describing the different head coaches of professional football teams and he said some are playing Checkers and a few are playing Chess. Life is too good to waste.

## **Step Three**

Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.

This step was extremely difficult for me, because my inability to understand it. My capacity for surrender was of no avail at that time, even accepting that I was an alcoholic was difficult. My thinking was that if I did this step all of a sudden I was not going to have any will. I would just lay down and let my higher power do it all. My relationship with my Higher Power at that time was not a very good one. YES, I knew there was a God, but I did not trust him, I blamed him for all the unmanageability of my life. I prayed and He did not do what I asked him, how could I trust him? Furthermore, now surrender to a God of my understanding.... not a Catholic God? Forget it. I was blind to the part of the step that reads MADE A DECISION.

For many years I had been self-sufficient, as a matter of fact, I was self-sufficient since I left home when I got married. I made the decision to make my own decisions and consulting with God was not even in my mind.

I told my sponsor I can't turn my will over to a foreign God and become a nobody, so I do not know if I can do this step. My sponsor explained this step this way: she dropped her keys and said, "I am making a decision to pick up my keys," and kept on repeating the same sentence over and over. I asked her, are you going to pick up your keys or not?, she said "I will." Then she picked them up and said to me, "first I made a decision and then took the action to pick them up, so it is with step 3, you make the decision and the action of the following steps will eventually make you turn your will and your life to the care of God." She told me that this step takes no action just acceptance and willingness.

I thought MAKING A DECISION is not too bad, and I was willing to do whatever was necessary to continue, not because I wanted to do the steps, but because my sponsor was on my back and other women with the same amount of sobriety were already on their 6th and 7th. I did not want to be "less than," so I made a decision to MAKE A DECISION.

I read in the 12 and 12, faith of some kind is possible to any one. I told an old-timer that I did not have faith, and he told me this story: A man came to his priest and told him, "I have no faith" and the priest told him, "you do have faith and I can prove it," the man asked "how?" the priest asked him "are you married?", he answered, "Yes," "Do you have any children?", he said "I have 3 children." Then he told him, "those are three acts of faith," the man said "I do not understand it," the priest said "your wife keeps on telling you they are yours and you keep on believing her, that is faith." So I did have faith, I understood.

Today I know that in the past my self will cut-off the light of the spirit and that my life was unmanageable by my own will power. Lack of power is my dilemma, so today I allow God's Power manage my life MOST OF THE TIME. But at times I take up my old job of being General Manager of the Universe, so my life and the lives of those around me become unmanageable. In a general way, this is what it was like, what happened, and what it is like now.....

## A Trust in the A. A. Process

A Power Greater than Myself

Why the program of Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A.) works so well, on the disease of alcoholism, is hard to fathom when we first come into A.A. Most of us are conflicted when confronted with the idea that our perception of life had been all wrong from the very start. Issues like, Faith, Higher Power, Insanity, Surrender, Denial, Guilt, Shame etc. had to be revisited to see where our past thinking had let us down. We realize that we have painted ourselves into the corner of life, and if we are lucky, we become open to the idea that we may have to seek outside help if we want to have any chance of a normal life. When we go through this process, in the spirit that it is presented, in The Big Book, (Alcoholics Anonymous) and the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions (12&12), wonderful things happen for us. I find it much easier to look back at the way the A.A. program has worked for me, than it was when I first entered the program and tried to look forward and perceive how it was going to influence every facet of my life in a wondrous way. I wish there were a way to package it and give it away but as I look back on my own experience in A.A. and realize how each of us are conditioned differently, I know that, not all of us can envision what the result will be, for if they did, they would cut right to the chase and never look back. In the beginning we usually spend most of our time coming to terms with the most obvious symptom of alcoholism; the drinking and I was no exception. Unfortunately, many of us never get deeper into the program, where most of the healing takes place. For those of us that do come to realize that happiness and, more importantly, peace of mind, are the things that are lacking in our lives and to acquire them, we may need to get serious and dig deeper into the process that led to these qualities. This does not mean that we will not experience joy and peace until we complete the process? Not at all, for every time we uncover another piece of the puzzle that barred us from being at peace with ourselves, it allows us to free up that part of our mind that has been wrestling with that issue and we can finally put it to rest. The day-to-day improvement in our own self esteem will be reward enough to inspire (inspirit) us to address the next issue that needs our attention, and one by one we resolve these matters as we Trudge the Road 0f Happy Destiny. Another thing that seems to be a natural result as we navigate this approach is that, with this new awareness, we refrain from making the regretful mistakes of the past that caused our discontent in the first place. Replacing the wrongs with the rights, you might say, doubles the pace of our growth. We only get to live once and it would be a shame to spend it with that awful mental grinding that goes on between our ears, when the solution is right before our eyes, and if we continue to spend all our mental energy obsessing on the "not drinking one day at a time" we can do this for years and then, one day, just pick up that drink. A drink has no appeal to alcoholics who are at peace with themselves and with others. Why waste the only life we have when the answers are laid there at our feet? Do not get stuck in the rut of complacency. Trust this process and ask yourself if you have been thorough with all twelve of the steps and if not, I recommend that you revisit those loose ends and deal with them. Give this a try, and I guarantee that, you will not regret it. Richard R.
